The Communications Workers of America (CWA) is currently bargaining contracts with AT&T nationwide. These talks cover over 100,000 workers represented by CWA and are the largest contract negotiations in the country this year. AT&T is the biggest unionized company in the U.S.

AT&T made \$12.9 billion in profits in 2008--\$2.4 billion last quarter alone. AT&T's top five executives were paid over \$33.5 million in bonuses last year. For investors, AT&T increased dividends by \$250 million in 2008.
